Liv Monica Bargem Stubholt is Deputy Minister in the Norwegian Ministry of Petroleum and Energy representing the Centre Party in the three party government coalition in Norway. Stubholt was Deputy Minister in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs from 2005 to September 2007. She has a broad political and academic background covering energy and environmental issues, EU and EEA law, High North issues as well as more than 15 years business experience. Liv Monica Bargem Stubholt is trained as a lawyer followed by an internship with the European Commission Legal Services. After working as an adviser to the Centre Party in the Norwegian Parliament, she worked with a Norwegian lobbying group for long term private investors. Stubholt became partner in one of Norway's leading law firms Bugge, Arentz-Hansen & Rasmussen (BA-HR). She has moreover been a guest lecturer in Community Law at the Norwegian School of Economics and Business Administration. In addition, Stubholt has been appointed to the board of the Norwegian power grid company Statnett as well as held positions on the Disciplinary Council for the Oslo branch of the Norwegian Bar Association, the board of the Institute for Social Research and on the Supervisory Committee for Anti-Money Laundering Measures.
