

The Challenge of Covering Presidential Elections

Gerard Baker is U.S. Editor and an Assistant Editor of *The Times* of London. He joined *The Times* in 2004 from the *Financial Times*, where he had spent more than ten years as Tokyo correspondent and Washington bureau chief. His weekly op-ed column appears in *The Times* on Fridays.

Frank Sesno, GWU Professor of Media and Public Affairs, is an Emmy-award winning journalist with more than 25 years of experience, including 18 years at *CNN*, where he serves as a special correspondent. He was previously *CNN* White House correspondent, anchor, and Washington bureau chief. Before joining *CNN*, he worked as a radio correspondent at the White House and in London for the *Associated Press*.

Karen Tumulty has been national political correspondent for *Time* since 2001, having joined the magazine as a congressional correspondent in 1994. She contributes regularly to *Time.com*'s political blog, "*Swampland*," and has also been White House correspondent. She previously spent 14 years at the *Los Angeles Times*, where her assignments included Congress, business, energy and economics.

Abbi Tatton is an Internet reporter for *CNN*, where she covers blogs, Web video and other new media for *The Situation Room*, and has explored the emergence of blogs and Web video as a force in national political campaigns. Since joining *CNN*'s Washington, bureau in 2000, she has also worked as a political producer and helped produce network special events, including political debates, town meetings, and the 9/11 attacks.
